The Fourth EURO Summer Institute

The Fourth EURO Summer Institute was held at Turku School of Economics and Business Administration, in Turku, Finland from 5 June to 21 June, 1987. The theme of the Institute was "Systems Science".

Following the traditions and the well-proved method of former EURO Summer Institutes the Summer Institute started during the weekend. The weekend consisted of two lectures, of informal exchange of ideas and of becoming acquainted with Finnish country side and with the Summer Institute city, Turku. This gave the ground for active, constructive and co-operative work and for the good atmosphere of the Summer Institute.

The scientific programme of the next two weeks consisted of presentations of the participants and of the lectures given by the invited speakers. In the summer institute there were 20 participants from 12 different countries. The papers dealt with different aspects of systems science. Kjell Samuelson (Stockholm University, Stockholm, Sweden) and prof. Len Troncale (California State Polytechnical University, U.S.A.) gave interesting and stimulating lectures. The themes of the lectures were:

- L. Troncale: "Bringing abstract systems theory to practical systems design",
- L. Troncale: "Future directions for systems science and for SGSR".

During our visits to firms our hosts and hostesses gave us talks about the firms they represented and about the special field the firm represented. In Imatran Voima Inc we had also a seminar where two lectures where given: J. Vaurio: "Probability Safety Assessment - Project" and Y. Seppälä: "Soft Systems Method".

When lectures and presentations were held the participants were divided into three working groups: 1. "Chaos, self-organization, control, development and economics" group: W. Carvajal, G. Engelen, S.-P. Kantola, T. Kinnunen, B. Kovacevic, J. César das Neves and A. Stachurski, 2. "Planning, decision making, DSS and expert systems" group: B. Golany, J. Holt, H. Kvaale, A. Ligeza, Z. Paprika and A. Rodrigues, 3. "Production and design algorithms" group: M. Båstrup, L. A. Hansen, D. Haugland, J. Leysen, Gy. Vastag, M. Widmer and P. Wijngaard. Because of the lack of time the working groups had little time to gather and work together.

However the co-operation within groups has continued by mail and with conversations in groups of two or three persons.
